## Kids at Bridges Preschool in Rosemount make special presents for Mother's Day

Many Mother's Day gifts were being made inside the Bridges Preschool House in Rosemount this past week. Some children were making handprints on paper while others were making Mother's

"Almost every day we have arts and crafts projects," said Mary Kaye Ervasti, owner of the Bridges Preschool House. "The kids get to bring home the decorations that they made. We also display their art here."

To be sure. The Bridges Preschool is filled with many colorful decorations made by the children. About 30 kids were busy making Mother's Day gifts and

other art projects on Wednesday. Ervasti is helped out by her teachers. "The teachers are the ones who work with the children," said Ervasti.

Most of the time it's fun time at the Bridges. It's even more fun and festive near special holidays like Mother's Day.

"We have parties for every holiday," said Ervasti. "In November we had a Thanksgiving feast. We had a big party at Christmas. We had a big St. Patrick's Day party and we sang Irish songs and had green treats. For Easter the kids colored Easter eggs. There seems to be

something special every month."

Ervasti is looking forward to even more special events in the next few months. If the weather cooperates, Ervasti and her staff will be able to go outside with the

preschoolers on sunny days.

"For spring, we are having a special teddy bear picnic," noted Ervasti. "We will have songs and games and stories. Hopefully we'll

The Bridges Preschool is open all year around. The ages of the tisks at the Preschool are from two-and-a-half to 12. The Preschool is open from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the week. "It's a very accommodating schedule for parents," said Ervasti.

Ervasti started the Bridges Preschool in 1973. "When I started I probably had about 40 kids," said Ervasti. "Now there are probably 100 kids that come in and out during the day. We get kids from Rosemount, Farmington, Eagan, Apple Valley — all throughout Dakota County."

Ervasti said she tries to have a daily schedule for the kids. In the morning and early afternoon there

are arts and crafts projects and games for kids. From 3:30 - 6 p.m. it's "play time," said Ervasti. Of course, there's also time for lunch, socializing and a rest time for the younger kids.

For Ervasti, there's rarely a dull moment at the Bridges. "We have activities that are constantly going on," she noted. "I like the variety. That's what keeps it from getting boring."

Throughout her 23 years working at the Bridges, Ervasti said she has tried to instill to the children "a love of life, a respect for one another, manners and a good set of values."

Most of Ervasti's family lives and works in Rosemount. Her brother, E.B. McMenomy, was the former Mayor of Rosemount.

Mother's Day with Cal's mom and my mom and my family," she said. "We're going to have a picnic."

Ervasti plans on staying in Rosemount for many years to come. "I love this community," she said. "This is my home. I have a lot of roots here."
