Larry has 3 college degrees from West Virginia University. He has a Bachelors Degree and was awarded the high honor of membership in Phi Beta Kappa. Larry also has been the Chair of the Charleston Legal Aid Society and more recently, a board member for the West Virginia Youth Symphony and for the Kanawha County Library Foundation and a member of the Vestry of Charleston's St. John's Episcopal Church.

Larry's passion is local history in Malden. He speaks regularly on the history of Old Malden and how its race culture is unique because of the heritage of his town as an early American industrial center in a mountain frontier culture. Malden is famous as the boyhood home of Booker T. Washington, who is West Virginia's greatest celebrity and most enduring historic figure in America.
