Proper Care of your New Glasses

Please clean and maintain your lenses by using a soft, lint free cloth and cleaning solution and cleaning solution. **DO NOT USE PAPER PRODUCTS!**

- To prevent scratching while cleaning, rinse lenses with water before using an anti-reflective safe cleaner or mild liquid soap.
- Dry your lenses with a microfiber or 100% cotton cloth.
- Never lay your eyewear face down.

- Avoid leaving your eyewear where it may be exposed to excessive heat (like a glove box or dashboard).
- Avoid exposure to ammonia, hair spray and household cleaners.
- Hand-wash your cleaning cloth periodically, avoiding fabric softeners.
