Kaopectate or Immodium AD Gatorade

Headaches

Tylenol (Regular or Extra Strength as directed) *NO ASPIRIN! NO IBUPROFEN!*

Heartburn/Upset Stomach

Maalox, Mylanta, Tums, Prilosec OTC or Zantac

Hemorrhoids

Maintain adequate dietary fiber and liquid intake Anusol Preparation H Rectal Suppositories or Cream Tucks Sitz Baths

Nausea

Emetrol (as directed) Vitamin B-6 (50 mg every 6 hours as needed) Unisom (1/2 tab) CAUTION- May cause drowsiness Phenergan

Sinus Colds

Afrin Nasal Spray (Use no longer than three consecutive days.) Saline Nose Spray

Sore Throat

Cepacol Chloraseptic Sucrets Lozenges

Vaginal Yeast Infection
