Introduction



Introduction

Methodology

This study was designed to assess the needs of people fifty-five (55) or older living in the Coastal Georgia Region. The study was conducted via random digit telephone interviewing and a total of 1,000 surveys were completed during the month of June 2015. The sampling error for binomially distributed data given a 95% confidence level is 3.1 percentage points.

The study examined physical and mental health needs, personal and home-related needs, nutritional and dietary needs, social and recreational needs, and financial needs and self-sufficiency. Comparisons to a similar study conducted in 2010 are made throughout this report where appropriate.






Health

Three out of four people (77%) over 55 years of age living in the Coastal Georgia region were in good health. Most of the people over 55 years in the study are confident that they can manage their own health. Over four out of five individuals (82%) over 55 in the study area could afford all health-related items and actions they needed such as eyeglasses, medical prescriptions, health insurance, etc.

Four out of ten residents (39%) of the Coastal Georgia regions who are over 55 years of age have none of the health-conditions listed in the study including diabetes, hypertension, cancer, arthritis, impaired vision, ambulatory difficulty, memory problems, hearing loss, or blindness. In other words, four in ten individuals were in rather good health. Only 6% of individuals had fallen in the past two months and hurt themselves enough to require medical attention -72% of those who did fall were able to get immediate medical attention. Over nine out of ten residents over 55 years of age in the study area (95%) have a personal physician or clinic.





Figure C - Do not have any conditions 3

In the past year, the typical 55+ year old in the Coastal Georgia region had spent no days in a hospital, nursing home, rehabilitation center, or homeless shelter. The typical person in the study area had spent twelve (12) days in the past month engaged in physical activity such as brisk walks, running, exercise classes, hiking, or playing sports.

Figure D - Percentage of people who spent days in the following:




While one in four individuals (27%) lacked knowledge to evaluate, two in three who did have sufficient information (64%) gave local agencies, organizations, and governments positive ratings for taking care of the healthcare needs of all people over 55 years of age in the Coastal Georgia region. Less than one in four individuals (23%) said their communities were doing only a fair or poor job of helping elderly people with feelings of isolation and depression. Only 15% of residents said there were obstacles in place that deterred them from receiving or accessing what they needed to maintain or improve their mental health – 18% responded similarly with regard to maintaining their physical health.

Nutrition/Diet

Large majorities of residents over 55 living in the Coastal Georgia region have enough food to eat (97%), have enough fresh fruits and vegetables (92%), and were able to prepare their own food (95%).

Emotional Health

Nearly nine out of ten residents in the study area (88%) described their quality of life as "excellent," "very good," or "good." Only 11% of residents experienced some depression and only 9% felt lonely and isolated. Only one in six residents (15%) claimed to be bored because of a lack of activities. Three in ten residents (29%), however, had lost someone close to them in the past year or two.





Figure F - Quality of life

Transportation

Nearly all individuals over 55 years of age in the study (94%) are healthy enough to leave their house to run errands, buy food, go to the doctor, etc.

Most individuals over 55 years of age living in the Coastal Georgia region drove their own vehicles (88%), while most of the rest (13%) relied on spouses, friends, and relatives for transportation. Over one in three of those individuals who did need transportation assistance (35%) had difficulty finding someone to take them on errands. Only one in six residents (15%) could afford to pay someone to take them to buy food, go to the doctor, etc.

Housing

Most residents (81%) over 55 years of age living in the Coastal Georgia region live in a single family house. Over nine in ten (91%) own their houses. Only 2% had to move within the past two years because they could not afford to stay, and only 1% had to move because they were no longer able to care for their houses.

One out of five individuals (21%) have some difficulty taking care of issues in and around their houses. For example, 8% have difficulty caring for tasks inside their houses, while 13% have difficulty performing outside tasks such as yard work.

Figure H - Type of housing






Figure I - Forced to move from house



A majority of those who did have difficulty (60%) said their houses were equipped to function with the disabilities they have. Relatively few (4%) have difficulty paying their utilities and only 3% have trouble paying their mortgage/rent.

Quality of Life

Just over one in five individuals (20%) in the study received assistance from spouses, friends, and neighbors for a wide range of activities such as yard work, housekeeping, running personal errands, transportation, and emotional support.

A little over one in twenty individuals (6%) received some assistance from senior centers, local governments, and churches for a wide range of activities such as housekeeping, yard work, social activities, transportation, providing meals at senior centers, and emotional support.

One out of every ten residents (10%) in the Coastal Georgia region who are over 55 years of age wanted to receive assistance from senior centers, local governments, and churches for things such as yard work, housekeeping, managing money/bills, and running personal errands.

Nearly half of people over 55 years of age (47%) claimed they would use a range of services if some organization provided them. Tops on the list were theatre and musical performances, day trips to attractions, museum & art gallery excursions, arts and craft classes, and computer and internet classes.

Six out of ten residents (61%) would use at least one or more community facilities if they were available in their communities. Most preferred facilities were libraries, parks/nature trails, recreation centers, pools and museums.

Caregiving

Only 6% of people in this study had placed a loved one in a care facility within the past year, and over half of these individuals (54%) said they would have benefitted from having a professional with whom to discuss this process.

One in seven individuals (14%) over 55 years of age in the Coastal Georgia region functioned as a caregiver for others – 41% of these individuals needed assistance or a break in their caregiving roles. Two in five of the caregivers (41%) felt burdened by their responsibilities – 41% had feelings of burden every day.

Civic Engagement

One in three individuals (33%) were willing to volunteer their time or expertise to help others. The typical person was willing to devote seven hours a week helping primarily at senior centers and schools.



Economic Self-Sufficiency

One in three individuals in the study (32%) worked outside the home for pay – the typical amount of hours worked is 37 hours a week. Another 19% wanted to work for pay. Eight out of ten individuals (78%) over 55 living in the study area were financially set or very close to it, while 16% were quite concerned about their economic wellbeing. Three in ten residents (30%) had long-term care insurance. About 20% of people did not seek government assistance because they were not sure what was available or what they qualified for.



In general, would you say your health is excellent, very good, good, fair, or poor?




Three out of four individuals (77%) in the Coastal Georgia region described their health as good, very good, or excellent, no change from 2010. Fewer than one in ten individuals (6%) indicated that their health was poor, down 3 percentage points from 2010.

Individuals in Liberty county (85%) were more likely to describe their health as good, very good, or excellent, while individuals in Screven (33%), Bulloch (26%), and Bryan (27%) counties were more likely to describe their health as only fair or poor.

How confident are you that you can manage your own health?




Two out of three individuals (67%) in the Coastal Georgia region were very confident they could manage their own health, while only 2% indicated that they were not at all confident they could manage their own health.

Individuals in Glynn (74%) and Bryan (72%) counties were more likely to be very confident about managing their own health, while individuals in McIntosh (9%) were more likely to be not at all confident about managing their own health.

Four out of five individuals (82%) living in the Coastal Georgia region can afford health-related products and actions such as eyeglasses, hearing aids, routine physical examinations, health insurance, etc. Conversely, one in seven individuals (14%) could not afford health aids such as eyeglasses, wheel chairs, hearing aids, and walkers. Just under one in ten individuals (9%) maintained they could not afford health insurance or medical prescriptions.


Long County residents were much more likely (100%) to indicate they could afford everything they needed. Conversely, only 72% of Bryan County residents were able to afford everything they needed.


Do you have any of the following conditions?

Over half of residents (54%) in the Coastal Georgia region suffered from diabetes, hypertension, cancer, arthritis or some other on-going condition. Incidence of one of these on-going conditions was greatest in McIntosh (76%), Bryan (65%), and Long (63%) counties, and lowest in Effingham (48%) and Liberty (49%) counties.

Nearly four in ten individuals (39%) experienced none of the conditions. Incidence of ambulatory difficulties was higher in McIntosh County (37%); and impaired vision was more prevalent in Long County (27%).






Fewer than one in ten individuals (6%) had fallen in the past two months and hurt themselves severely enough to require medical attention. Over seven out of ten individuals who fell (72%) were able to get medical care immediately after the incident, down 19% points from 2010.

Individuals in Long (17%) and Camden (14%) counties were more likely to have fallen and hurt themselves in the past two months.



Do you have a personal physician or medical clinic you consider as your physician or clinic?




Over nine out of ten residents (95%) in the Coastal Georgia region have a personal physician or medical clinic they consider to be their personal physician. This percentage was up 4 points compared to 2010. All residents in Effingham County claimed they have a personal physician, while only 85% of residents in Screven County have a personal physician.

In the past year, about how many days have you spent in a hospital?




Fewer than one in five residents (19%) had spent any days in the hospital in the past year. Most hospital stays were one week or less. McIntosh County (25%) and Effingham County (24%) residents were most likely to have spent a day in the hospital over the past year, while Glynn (10%) and Screven (10%) County residents were less likely to have done so.

In the past year, about how many days have you spent in a nursing home?



In the past year, about how many days have you spent in a rehabilitation facility?





Eight in ten residents who had been in a hospital, nursing home, or rehabilitation facility in the past year (80%) indicated that they got the support they needed after they were discharged. Less than one in ten residents (8%) did not get the support they needed for their transition home.

Residents of Long County (67%) were more likely to indicate that they did not need help after their discharge.



In the past month, about how many days have you engaged in physical activity like brisk walks, running, exercise class, hiking, playing sports, etc.?




The typical resident in the Coastal Georgia region spent twelve (12) days in the preceding month engaging in physical exercise such as taking brisk walks, running, participating in exercise classes, hiking, etc., five more days than the typical resident in 2010. Some residents were much more active than the typical resident as the average number of days of physical activity (15) was slightly higher than the median number of days (12). Twelve as the median number of days of activity means that 50% of residents engaged in activity more than 12 days per month and 50% engaged in activity fewer than 12 days in the preceding month.

Residents in McIntosh more physically active, while residents in Bryan, Liberty, and Screven counties were less physically active.


Nearly three in ten residents (27%) were uncertain how well agencies and healthcare providers were caring for the healthcare needs of people over 55 years of age in the Coastal Georgia region. Most residents who were knowledgeable enough to offer an opinion felt that agencies and healthcare providers were doing a good, very good, or excellent job of caring for the healthcare needs of people over 55 in the region.

Residents in Bulloch and Liberty counties were more likely to give high marks to agencies and healthcare providers for the care they provide to people over 55 in the region. In contrast, residents of McIntosh County gave comparatively lower scores to agencies and healthcare providers.


While over two in five residents (41%) were not certain, comparatively more residents with sufficient information to judge gave their community organizations fair or poor ratings rather than excellent or very good ratings in helping people over 55 with feelings of isolation, loneliness, and depression: 16% of residents said their communities were doing a very good or excellent job in helping people over 55, while 23% gave their communities fair or poor ratings for helping people over 55 with feelings of isolation, loneliness, and depression.

Comparatively high percentages of residents in McIntosh County (38%) gave fair or poor ratings to their communities' efforts to help people over 55 with feelings of isolation, loneliness, and depression.

Are there obstacles that you and your peers face in receiving or accessing what you need to maintain or improve your mental health?




One in seven residents (15%) in the Coastal Georgia region indicated that they face obstacles in receiving or accessing what they need to maintain or improve their mental health. Residents in McIntosh (30%), Glynn (24%), and Screven (23%) counties were more likely to feel this way, while few residents in Bryan (2%) and Long (7%) counties believed they faced obstacles to access what they needed to maintain their mental health.

What are these obstacles?



Money was the key obstacle that keeps people in the Coastal Georgia region from accessing what they need to maintain their mental health - nearly half of residents (46%) indicated that individuals do not have enough, and one in four residents (24%) indicated agencies, organizations, and governments do not have enough money.

Lack of quality mental healthcare providers and too few agencies/organizations that take care of people's mental health were obstacles mentioned by one in four residents (24%).





















Can you afford to pay someone to take you to buy food, or take you to the doctor, etc.?













Very few people over 55 years of age received assistance for legal issues, physical rehabilitation, cultural activities, dealing with physical or emotional abuse, or adult day care from spouses, friends, and neighbors.







Nearly half of residents (47%) over the age of 55 living in the Coastal Georgia region would participate in a wide range of activities (included in the above table) with peers if some organization provided the activities.



Most popular activities people would do with peers if some organization provided it was going to live performances (theatre, musical, movies, and sporting events) as 21% of residents would do this. Bulloch County residents (31%) were especially likely to do this type of activity if some organization facilitated it.

Nearly one in five residents (18%) would go on day trip to tourist attractions if some organization provided this activity – residents in Bulloch (27%) and Effingham (26%) counties were more likely to desire this activity. Seventeen percent (17%) of residents said they would visit museums or art galleries if some group facilitated this activity.

The least popular activity (participating in political and civic discussions) was desired by 7% of residents if some organization would provide it. Seven percent of residents over 55 represent a significant number of people, which indicates that there are sizeable segments of people 55 and older who will do a myriad of activities if some organization will facilitate it.

Residents over 55 living in Coastal Georgia region were given a list of twenty-five (25) amenities/ activities and they were instructed to indicate if they would use them or use them more frequently if they were available in their community.

Three in five residents (61%) claimed they will participate in at least one of the activities if available. Going to the library was the most popular as 30% of residents said they would do this if it were (more readily) available in their communities. Over one in three Liberty County residents (35%) would go to the library more if it were readily available.

Going to parks and nature trails was the next most popular activity as 26% would go with intended participation greatest among Liberty County residents (34%). Around one out of five residents would go to a recreation center, pools, museums, or art galleries if they were in the community.

Comparatively few residents would utilize adult day care centers, investment clubs, benches/shelters for bus stops or tennis courts if they were available.

In the past 12 months, have you placed a loved one in a nursing home or retirement community or assisted living facility?



Would it have been helpful to you at that time to talk this over with someone who is trained to help people emotionally at times like these?*





Are you the main helper for someone who needs assistance with everyday acrivities such as bathing, feeding, dressing, eating, and other personal needs?



Do you ever need assistance or a break from providing care for this person?*











How often do you feel burdened by caring for another person?*













Based on all of your sources of money, for example, savings, retirement, social security, job, etc., which of the following best fits how you feel?






















